#### 100 years of Warrimoo







On the weekends I play basketball for Joeys Basketball Club. I also play for Penrith Panthers Rep association.


In 2013, there was a big bush fire near here that destroyed 200 homes.

## **Well Done Swimmers!**

What a fabulous School Swimming Scheme!

We would like to congratulate those students who have just completed the intensive swimming program. Not only were they very brave on the cold days, but also every child made great progress with a huge smile on their face!

All children participated in survival activities, as well as distance swimming and stroke correction.

On day 1 all children tested as being able to swim between 0-24 metres using the correct freestyle stroke. By day 9, 21 children achieved swimming 25 metres confidently, with 12 swimmers achieving 50 metres and completing the program. Those who started as non-swimmers developed confidence and are now able to propel themselves through the water with many achieving a 10metre swim. Also, 37 students can now confidently swim 50metres in a chosen survival stroke, in case of an emergency.

The instructors commented on our student's very positive attitudes and engagement throughout the two-week program. Students should be proud of their progress and swimming achievements, as well as their behaviour.




## **MONTHLY P&C MEETING**

#### **Trial Canteen Model for Term 4**

With great thanks to Emma Murison and support from our P&C we are excited to be offering a new model for our canteen for this term. This is a trial to see if a combination of outsourcing meals and some over the counter sales would be a more sustainable model for our school community while still maintaining some of the important features of our school canteen such as healthy, affordable options for our kids, offering a break for parents to packing lunches once a week, and still raising some funds for the many things our P&C contributes to our school programs.

My School Lunch Box – www.myschoollunchbox.com.au

#### What is My School Lunch Box?

My School Lunchbox is a Blue Mountains business that has developed a business supplying school lunches to over 20 schools from the Blue Mountains and Penrith areas. The food is made locally in Leura and they are fully compliant with relevant food safety and hygiene regulations.

#### How does it work?

Parents order and pay for their child's lunch order online by 8am on the lunch order day (Friday). The order is then made and packaged in 100% recyclable lunch boxes. It is labelled with the child's names, class, school etc and delivered to the school just before lunch time. Cold food is kept cold with ice packs and hot food is kept warm in special boxes. The lunches will be distributed by parent volunteers (If you can help for 1 hour please contact Emma – see details above).

The first Friday for orders is Friday 2 November.


#### What is on the Menu?

#### How do I order?


To order you will need to set up an account at www.myschoollunchbox.com.au.

- 1. Go to www.myschoollunchbox.com.au and click on 'sign up' in the top right corner of the web page
- 2. You'll need to create a username and password and put in your name and a contact phone number. (Hint: the password needs to be at least 8 characters, have a capital and a special character (@#\$%\*) in it for example Warrimoo#)
- 3. Once you do that login and go to the top right of the webpage and click on your name and select My Students



4. You then need to add your child by typing in their name, selecting Warrimoo Public School and their year. In the extra information box make sure you type in your child's class, so that we can make sure the order goes to the correct classroom. Make sure you save your changes.

5. You then need to place an order. You do this by selecting Place Order:



- 1. Then you just scroll through the different options and select the option(s) you want to order and add the optional extras if you want them. For example with the sandwiches you can select what bread, and then extra fillings if you want them. This is also where you check/select the date for your order.
- 2. Then after you have finished adding what you want to your order select pay now. You can pay with paypal or credit card.

Orders need to be completed by 8am on Friday morning at the latest. If you are ordering close to 8am you may want to ring My School lunch box and confirm that they have received your order.
