Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Catastrophic Fire Danger Rating

I would like to commence this newsletter by thanking the entire school community of Warrimoo Public School for the support offered regarding our recent cease in operations on Tuesday 12th November 2019 due to the catastrophic fire danger warning. I realise that the impact to families throughout this time has been stressful arranging supervision of their children by relying on family members, friends or even taking leave from work, however the number one focus of the school is to keep our students safe at all times. While we have tight procedures in relation to our Fire Management Plans at Warrimoo and frequently reinforce the message of being prepared with our students, part of being prepared is keeping away from potential incidents and issues in relation to bush fire.

Early last week our school conducted a 'Shelter in Place' drill at school. I would like to report that every student and staff member responded quickly, appropriately and responsibly. The work around being prepared that the Rural Fire Service of Warrimoo and the school have delivered in partnership, ensured that actions were swift and procedures were followed.

This year we expect to have to provide about 350+ hampers.
