- 4 A4 plastic document envelopes
- Paint shirt
- 1 A4 20 pocket display folders
- 2 x 64 page scrapbooks (335x245mm)
- 3 Whiteboard markers

Year 3-6 Basic Requirements for 2020

In a SMALL pencil case for desk:-

- 4 x HB lead pencils (pacers are okay)
- 1 <u>30cm</u> ruler (with millimetres)
- 1 white eraser
- 1 packet coloured pencils
- 1 fine felt tip black pen (0.4mm)
- 1 medium felt tip black pen (0.6mm)
- 1 thick black texta
- 4 red pens (not felt tip)
- 1 pair scissors
- 1 pencil sharpener (not battery operated)
- 4 whiteboard markers
- 4 blue pens (not felt tip Years 4,5,6)
- 2 display folders

Also:

- 1 bottle of liquid soap
- 1 box tissues Large
- 1 roll paper towel
- Paint shirt
- 4 large white Bostik glue sticks (will be stored until required)
- Textas in a separate pencil case

Wet wipes

Long black pants and a plain black t-shirt (no logo)

As a parting gift here is the cookie recipe:

Canteen choc chip cookies 2019

No egg used at school but I have given both options.

Ingredients:

125g butter

1/2 cup raw sugar

1/2 cup brown sugar

1 egg **OR** 3 tablespoons hot water and I tablespoon chia seeds

1/2 teaspoon vanilla

1 ¾ cup self raising flour

150g choc chip bits (white and milk) or however many you think looks good!

Method:

Oven at 180 C

If using chia instead of egg, make it now – put chia seeds and hot water in a cup to combine and set aside as it needs to be gloopy.

Cream together butter, sugar and vanilla

Add egg or chia mix

Mix in flour

Add choc chips.

Roll into balls about dessert spoon size and put on lined baking tray, don't squish them down.

Bake for about 12 minutes or until you smell them.
