#### Entering & exiting the school grounds

Student safety is of the utmost of importance here at Warrimoo Public School. For safety reasons we ask that all students and visitors to the school enter and exit the using the main entrance gate near the administration office of the school. While I am certain it is convenient to use the carpark near the infants block, it is essential that this is not utilised for entry and exit of the school grounds. With the movement of vehicles around our site, carparks are not the place to be walking through.

Please note that the staff carpark is to be used for staff vehicles only. It is essential that all visitors, during drop off and pick up times, do not park within these areas. While we strongly encourage the use of the main gate at our school it is still possible that a child could be walking through and be struck by a moving vehicle. Additionally, keeping the carpark clear is essential in event that an emergency vehicle is required to be called to the school. Finally, please refrain from parking in the drop off and pick up bus bay. This area must remain free in order for our school bus to drop off and pick up the students from our school and safely turn around.

Florabella Street is quite narrow and at the best of times can become an obstacle negotiating down it safely and successfully. Please be aware that many families, both in vehicles and as pedestrians, use this space to arrive and depart Warrimoo Public School. We are all very busy in our lives and have places to be, however patience towards oncoming traffic and pedestrians will hopefully ensure that we all arrive at our destinations in good health.

The safety of all our students, parents and staff is of the utmost of importance!

## School Cross Country 2019

Our School Cross Country will be held on Friday 5th April. The track will be around the school including some areas of the bush behind the buildings.

Students who are turning 8, 9 or 10 years old this year will run 2 kilometres. This includes any Year 2 students who are turning 8 this year and wish to run the longer course. The students, who are turning 11 or 12 years old, will be running 3 kilometres.

It will start at 9:30am with the Junior Races (8, 9 &10 years), then the 11's races and finally the 12's Races. This may continue until after recess if necessary.

Each child will need to wear clothes and shoes suitable for running. If they wish, they may wear a shirt in their house colour. They will also need a water bottle, a hat and sunscreen.

While the primary children are running, the children from Kindergarten, Year 1 and the remainder of Year 2 will have short mini Cross Country Races around the oval. They can wear their house colours as well. The new students and Kindergarten children have been told what house they are in.

To make this event successful and safe we need help from parents. As some of the areas are in the bush, it is necessary to have spotters to ensure that the children are going the correct way and also to help if necessary. Spotters will need a chair, a mobile phone in case there is a need to ring the school office for help, and whatever else you think you might need to pass the time.
