Tree Maintenance at Warrimoo Public School

I am certain that you have heard about the horrific news during the school holidays where a lady was tragically killed in Katoomba when a tree fell on her car. I offer the family our deepest condolences on behalf of Warrimoo Public School.

Towards the conclusion of Term 2 I had our annual arborist inspection completed on the trees within our school. The large Sydney Blue Gum tree, in the main area of our asphalt area, was identified as being of HIGH risk with tree defects. A request for further investigation to be conducted was made and possible removal. Following the results from this inspection I made contact with Blue Mountains Council and they have issued a removal approval. The safety of the students, staff, parents and community is of the utmost importance and due to the uncertain nature of the tree I will be seeking quotes to remove it. It is anticipated that the work will be conducted throughout a weekend period to minimise the disruption to the school.

Book Week Performance



Our day will commence at 9:00 am with the Acknowledgement of Country, Flag Raising and March, followed by a Smoking Ceremony led by our local Blue Mountains Aboriginal Educational Consultative Group members.

After this, our class groups will be rotating through a variety of activities, including campfire and damper making, artwork in classrooms and chalk drawing. It will be imperative that all students be on time for bus departure at 8:40 am transporting our students to East Blaxland Public School.

Both schools will be making alternative arrangements on the day to ensure students with health concerns regarding the smoking ceremony will be relocated away from this event and on the day gluten free damper mix will be provided for those children who require it. If your child has any other allergies, please let us know so we can accommodate them. Regular damper is made with just self-raising flour and water. The damper will be served with golden syrup for those students wishing to partake.

Parents are welcome to come along and enjoy the assembly in the morning with their children.

Please note that students are asked to wear red, black and yellow as a mark of respect on the day.

We are looking forward to a fantastic day and this event will be sponsored through our school and therefore no expenses will be incurred by families.

ATTENTION: K-6 GYMNASTICS PROGRAM



As part of the PD Health PE syllabus, gymnastics will again be offered as sport in Term 3. As in past years we have a professional provider, FITSCHOOL FITKIDS, who will provide two accredited coaches, specialised equipment and programs tailored to the stage ability levels. The lessons will be held in the hall and utmost care is taken to prevent injuries. The class teacher will be present at all times.

In the past students have responded positively to lessons and have shown marked improvement in skill development. The coaches have also been able to identify children with potential in the area of gymnastics, recommending pathways for students to further pursue gymnastics if so desired.

The cost for the program will be \$16.50 per student. This amount has been subsidised \$13.50 per student as a result of the school receiving a grant from Sporting Schools Australia.

The lessons will commence on Monday, 29th July 2019 and continue each Monday for 8 weeks.

The final date for payment is *Thursday*, 25th July 2019.

Gymnastics programs at Warrimoo Public School have always been an enjoyable, stimulating experience for children and as staff we are asking that all children participate.


