Principal's Report

Dear Parents & Caregivers,

I am very much looking forward to the year ahead and working alongside you and your children to achieve the very best academic, social and emotional outcomes for every student in every classroom. Anaphylaxis Students at Warrimoo Public School

I would like to shine a spotlight on a critical health topic - Anaphylaxis. Understanding this severe allergic reaction is vital for everyone, as it can affect individuals of all ages. Anaphylaxis is a sudden and severe allergic reaction that can be life-threatening. It occurs within minutes of exposure to allergens, such as certain foods, insect stings, medications, or even exercise. Recognising the signs is crucial for prompt action.

Some key indicators include; difficulty breathing, swelling of the face and throat, rapid or weak pulse, hives and gastrointestinal symptoms (nausea, vomiting).

Anaphylaxis is a serious health concern, but with awareness and preparedness, we can make a difference. Creating an anaphylaxis-aware school community is a shared responsibility. Please note that we have several anaphylactic students within the school with allergies ranging from nuts, raw egg, shell fish, penicillin, lavender, sesame seeds and black ant bites.

I respectfully request that wherever possible that you eliminate the above at school to assist in keeping all our students safe.



2024 Classes

This year we have **146** students enrolled at Warrimoo PS with 6 classes.

The classes were developed after carefully considering many factors including:

- In depth discussions with the previous year classroom teachers
- · Individual learning habits
- Our targeted programs
- Our disproportionate student enrolments numbers
- · Historical data collected from previous years
- Our maximum class sizes for our K-2 classes
- We also endeavoured to minimise the possibility of restructuring classes later as new enrolments may occur in these classes



Classes are developed to support educationally and socially balanced groups with a differentiated curriculum to meet the needs of all our students at Warrimoo Public School. Class teachers will be providing specific class and stage information at our Parent Information Sessions.


Security Breaches
